



Tobacco in West Virginia

CIGARETTE USE^{*1-2}




% of High School Students who Currently Smoke



OTHER TOBACCO USE

- The prevalence of smokeless tobacco use among adults in West Virginia was 8.5% in 2014.³
- In 2015, 13.4% of high school students in West Virginia used chewing tobacco, snuff, or dip on at least one day in the past 30 days. Nationally, 7.3% of high school students used smokeless tobacco on at least one day in the past 30 days.²
- In 2015, 13.9% of high school students in West Virginia smoked cigars, cigarillos, or little cigars on at least one day in the past 30 days. Nationally, 10.3% of high school students smoked cigars, cigarillos, or little cigars on at least one day in the past 30 days.²
- In 2015, 31.2% of high school students in West Virginia used electronic vapor products on at least one day in the past 30 days. Nationally, 24.1% of high school students used electronic vapor products on at least one day in the past 30 days.²

ECONOMICS OF TOBACCO USE AND TOBACCO CONTROL

- In FY2017, West Virginia allocated \$3.0 million in state funds to tobacco prevention, which is 11.1% of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Annual Spending Target.⁴
- West Virginia received an estimated \$259.2 million in tobacco settlement payments and taxes in FY2017.4
- The health care costs in West Virginia, directly caused by smoking, amount to \$1.00 billion annually.⁴
- West Virginia loses \$1.23 billion in productivity each year due to smoking.⁵

STATE TOBACCO LAWS⁶⁻⁸

EXCISE TAX

- The state tax increased to \$1.20 per pack of cigarettes in July 2016. West Virginia is ranked 33rd in the United States for its cigarette tax. The national average cigarette tax is \$1.71 per pack of cigarettes. The highest state cigarette tax is New York (\$4.35) and the lowest state cigarette tax is Missouri (\$0.17).
- E-cigarette liquid is taxed 7.5 cents per milliliter. All other tobacco products are taxed 12% of the wholesale price.

State Cigarette Tax

CLEAN INDOOR AIR ORDINANCES

- Smoking is prohibited in public schools only.
- Smoking restrictions are required in childcare facilities and government workplaces.

YOUTH ACCESS LAWS

- The minimum age requirement for the purchase of tobacco products is 18, and penalties exist for both minors and merchants who violate this law.
- The possession, importation, distribution, and sale of bidis to both minors and adults is prohibited.
- The sale of vapor products to minors is prohibited.

CESSATION STATISTICS AND BENEFITS

- The CDC estimates that 51.5% of adult every day smokers in West Virginia tried to quit smoking for one or more days in 2015.⁹
- The Affordable Care Act requires all Medicaid programs cover all tobacco cessation medications beginning January 1, 2014.^{8†}
- West Virginia's state quitline invests \$8.83 per smoker; the national average investment per smoker is \$3.46.⁸
- West Virginia has no private insurance mandate provision for cessation.⁸
